


COOKBOOK ORDERS

ARCHIVES OF MICHIGAN NEWS

There will be two exciting new additions to the Seeking Michigan web site.

FIRST, an index to Michigan death records from 1921-1952, with actual images from 1921-1937.

with the 75-year restriction on access to Michigan death records. Every January the Archives will add another The agreement with Michigan Department of Community Heath made this possible. Will be available online soon!

SECOND, These documents will be also on Seeking Michigan. The Archives has reached an agreement with FamilySearch to digitize and index all of our naturalization records of Michigan. The index at FamilySearch will point to Seeking Michigan. This project will take a little bit longer, because they have to scan and index them yet. Also the Archives has been working with several MGC member societies to add their local society publications to the Archives holdings. 796I

The following change to amend the bylaws has been proposed and will be voted on in October.

MUSKEGON COUNTY GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY BYLAWS CHANGE PROPOSED (bolded-in red)

ARTICLE II — PURPOSE

The purposes of the Society shall be:

- to gather people interested in genealogy and family history, with particular interest in Muskegon County, Michigan;
- **Change** to gather people interested in genealogy and family history, with **emphasis on** Muskegon County, Michigan:
- to promote genealogy research and public access to genealogical materials;
- Change—to promote genealogical research and public access to genealogical materials:
- to teach members research methods, documentation standards, sources and other skills;
- **Change**—to teach members research methods, documentation standards, (take out—sources and other skills;
- **4.** to collect, compile, publish, and disseminate Muskegon County genealogical data;
- Change—to collect, compile, publish, and (take out disseminate) Muskegon County genealogical data;
- **5.** to contribute genealogy materials and other aid to Hackley Public Library;
- Change—to contribute genealogy materials and other aid to Hackley Public Library-Local History & Genealogy Department.

GREAT NEW BOOK!

What's in a Surname - A Journey from Abercrombie to Zwicker by David McKie

Surnames are much more than convenient identity tags; they are windows into our families' pasts.



Some suggest ancestral trades (Butcher, Smith, Roper) or physical appearance (Long, Brown, Thynne). Some provide clues to where we come from (McDonald, Evans, Patel). And some - Rymer, Brocklebank, Stolbof - offer a hint of something just a little more exotic or esoteric. He considers whether fortune favours those whose surnames come at the beginning of the alphabet. And he celebrates the remarkable and the quirky, from the fearsome Ridley (the cry of which once struck terror in the hearts of their neighbors) to the legend-encrusted Tichborne, whose most famous holders were destined to suffer misfortune and controversy. Elegiac and amusing by turns, he offers a wonderfully entertaining wander along the footpaths of the nation's history and culture. celebrating not just the Smiths and Joneses of these islands but the Chaceporcs and Swetinbeddes, too.

LATEST FREE ONLINE RECORDS

The Irish Genealogical Research Society's marriage database has now reached 50,000 names. This database is a good source for pre-civil registration marriages in Ireland and it is comprised of information from a variety of non-traditional sources such as chancery bills, diaries, deeds, marriage settlements, memorial inscriptions, wills, family letter and newspapers. The German Genealogy Group continues to add to its collection of free searchable databases. The group based on Long Island, New York is focussed on German genealogy, but it has a variety of records that would be of interested to many people. There are databases for marriages, naturalizations, cemeteries, churches, veterans and even yearbooks. One particularly nice database is the surname database that is a compilation of the German surnames submitted by members of the group that shows how to contact members for various surnames and regions of Germany.
